Questions:

Marriage & Divorce

- 1. On the event of a wedding day, there is a covenant made between a man and a woman. How does the world around us approach this promise? What does God intend in this covenant that is made?
- 2. Marriage is to reflect Jesus' love for the Church an example and demonstration of the goodness of our God. How does this change your perspective on the purpose of marriage?

<u>Anger</u>

- 3. Anger is sometimes described as a secondary emotion (there is always an underlying emotion which leads to it). What are some of the things that may lead people to feel anger?
- 4. How do we balance the desire for justice and expressing love for our enemies? Peace and reconciliation may be the reward for withholding retaliation is this worth it?

Generosity

- 5. What is it about generosity that is so powerful in molding and shaping our hearts and minds? What are some specific ways you can be generous in your community?
- 6. "We have been blessed so that we can bless others". How does this idea shift your perspective on giving and generosity? Have you ever had a similar experience to Pastor Justin when you were driven to be more generous?
- 7. How do we balance the idea that 'God doesn't need our money' with the reality that the local church does need funding to operate?
- 8. What are the challenges of keeping our generosity 'secret'? Is it okay to share with others how God has blessed us through faith-full tithing?
